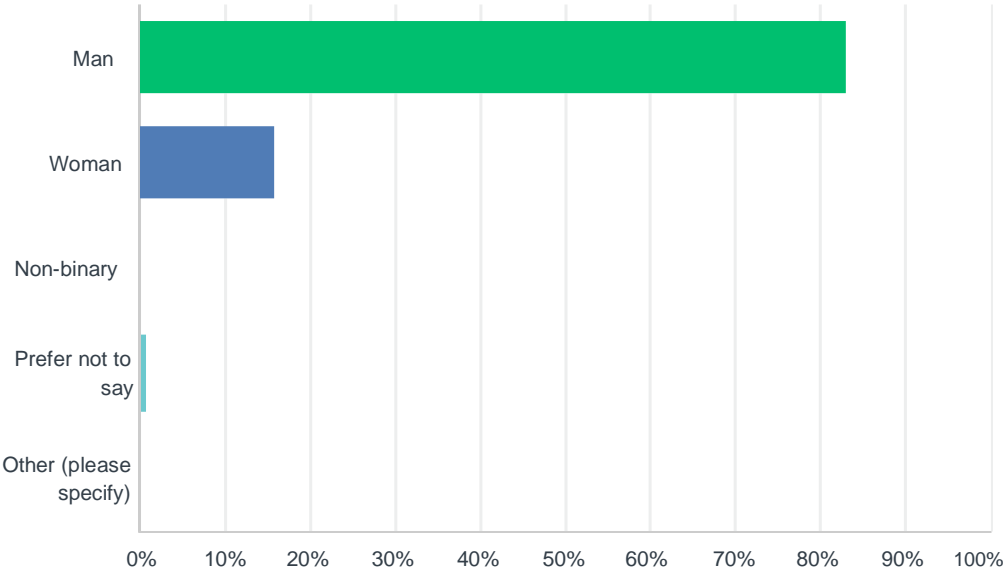

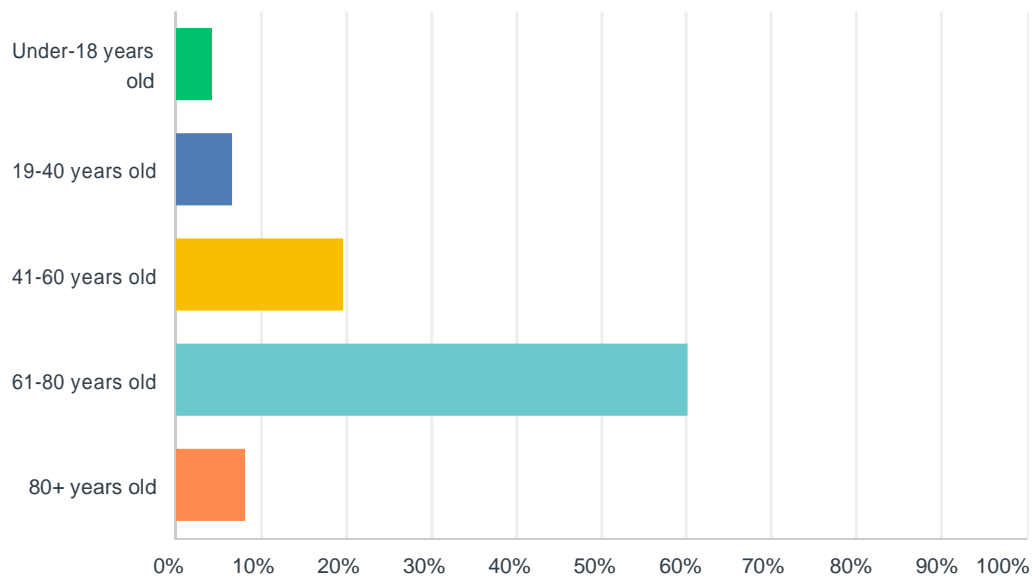

Q2 How old are you?

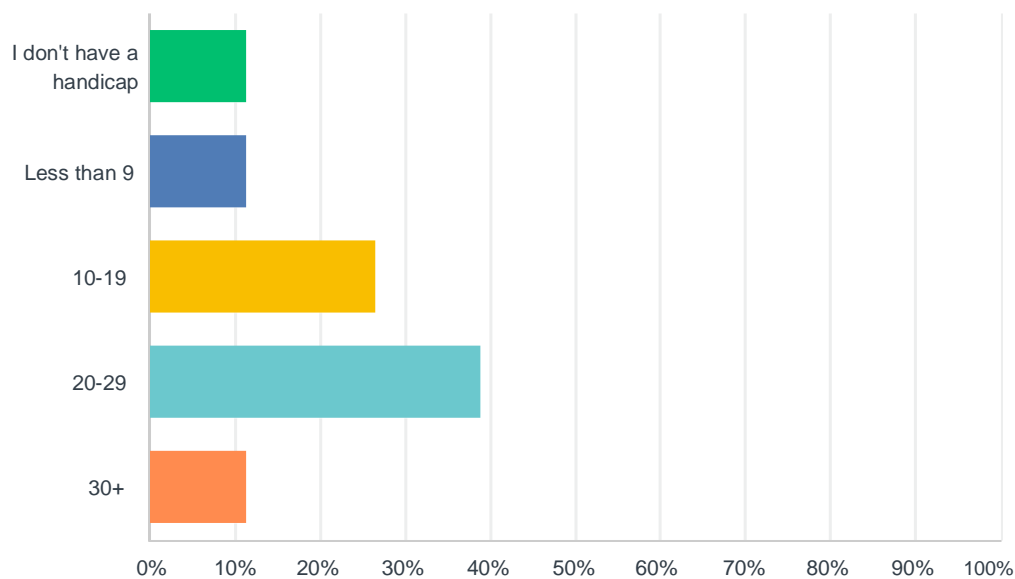

Q3 What is your Golf Australia handicap?

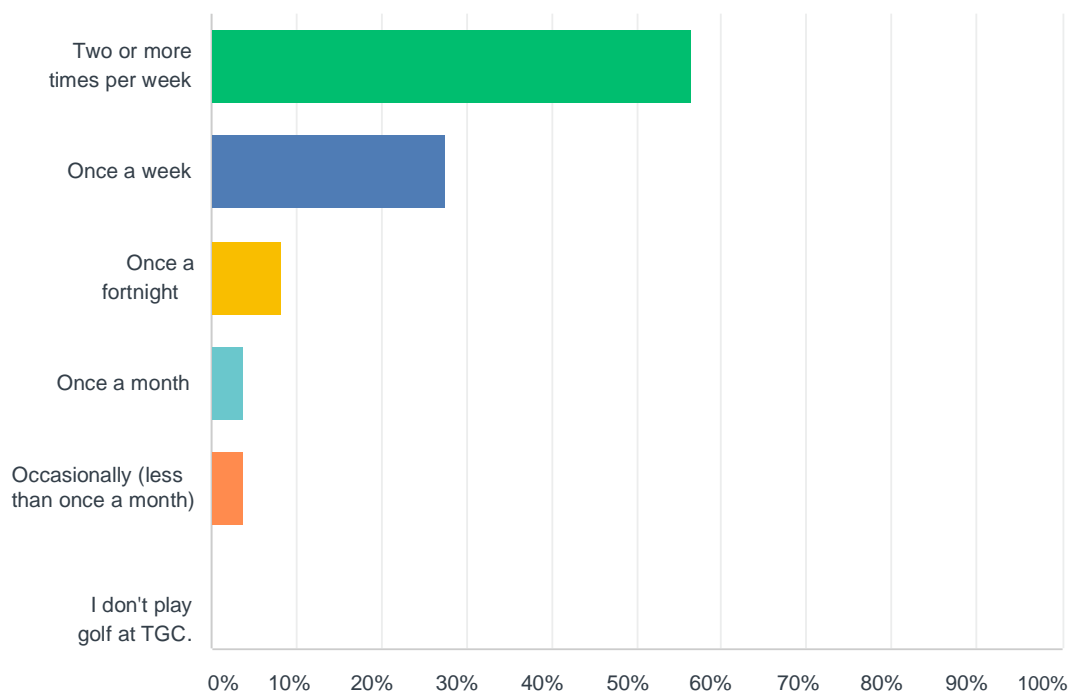

Q4 How often do you play golf at Trafalgar Golf Club?

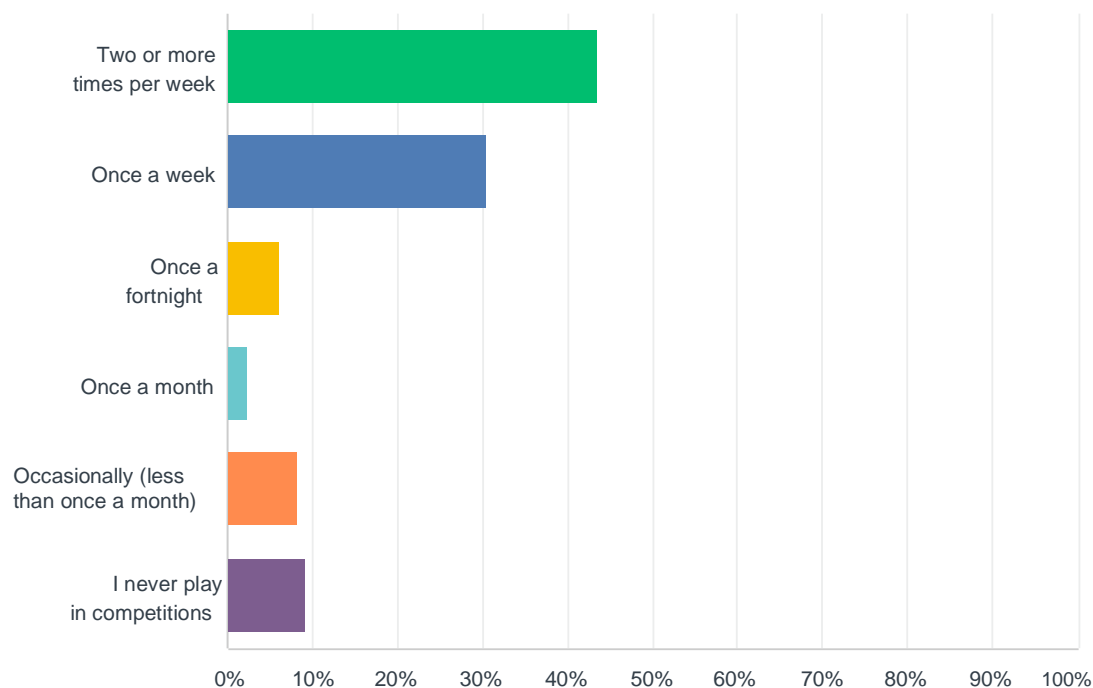

Q5 How often do you play in competitions at Trafalgar Golf Club?

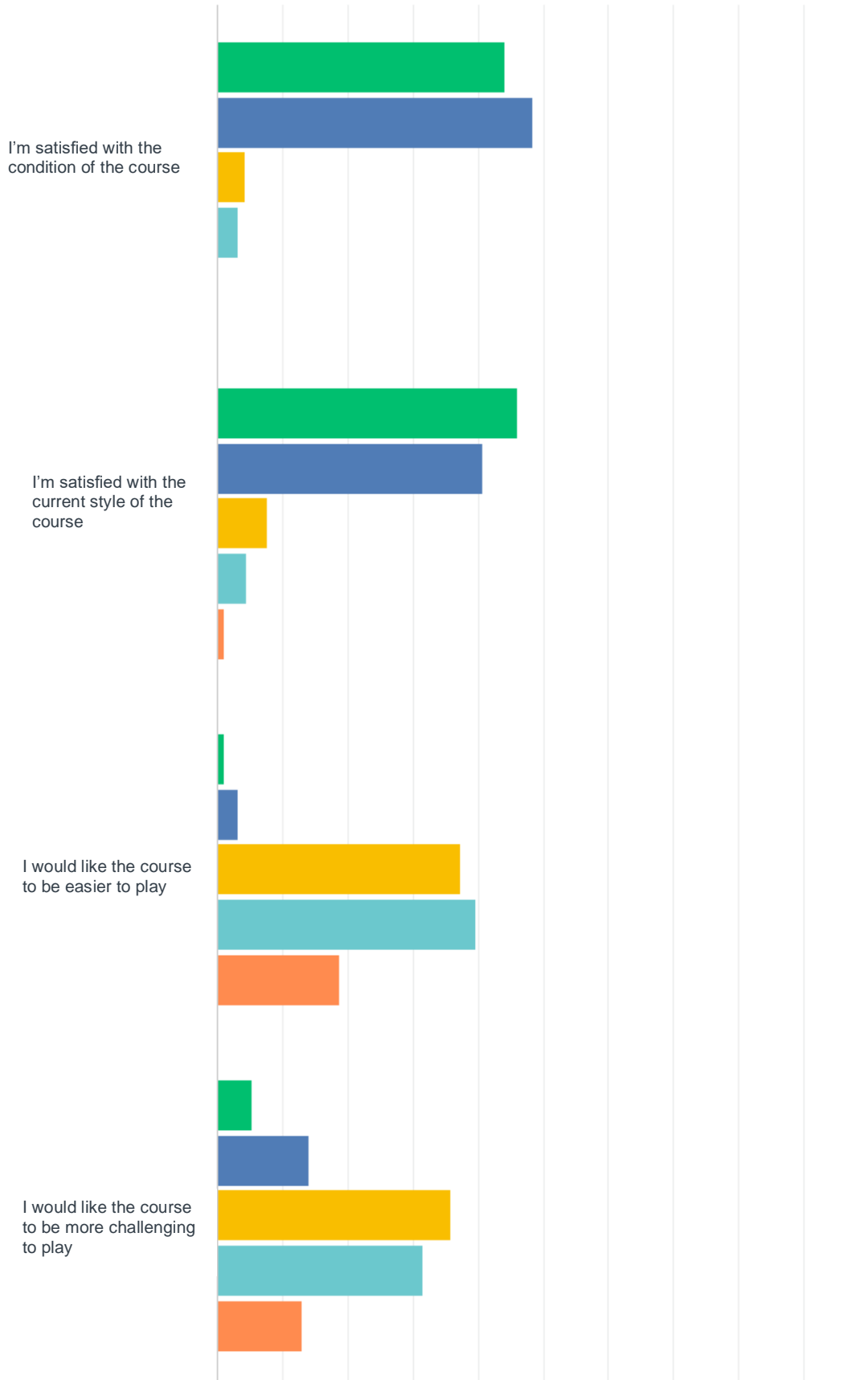

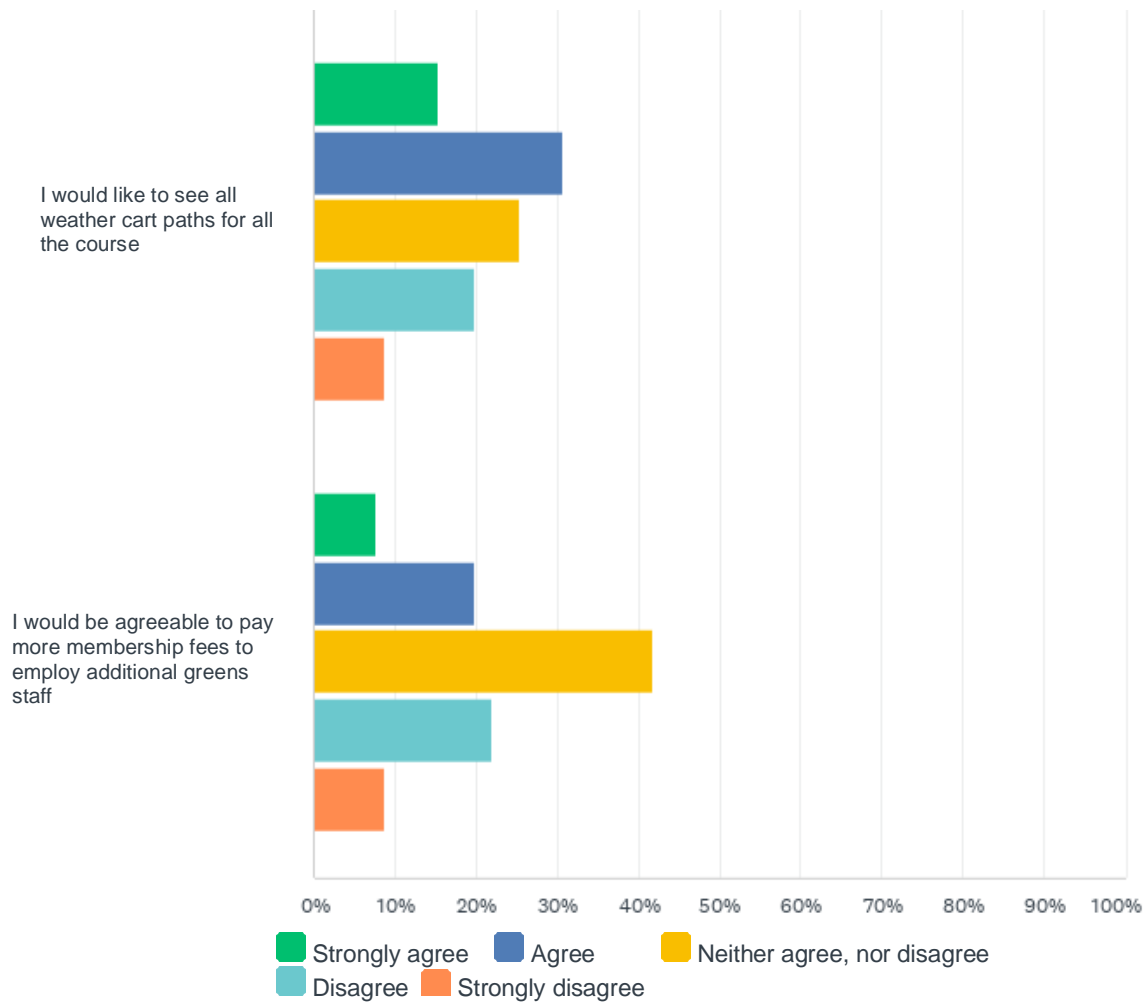

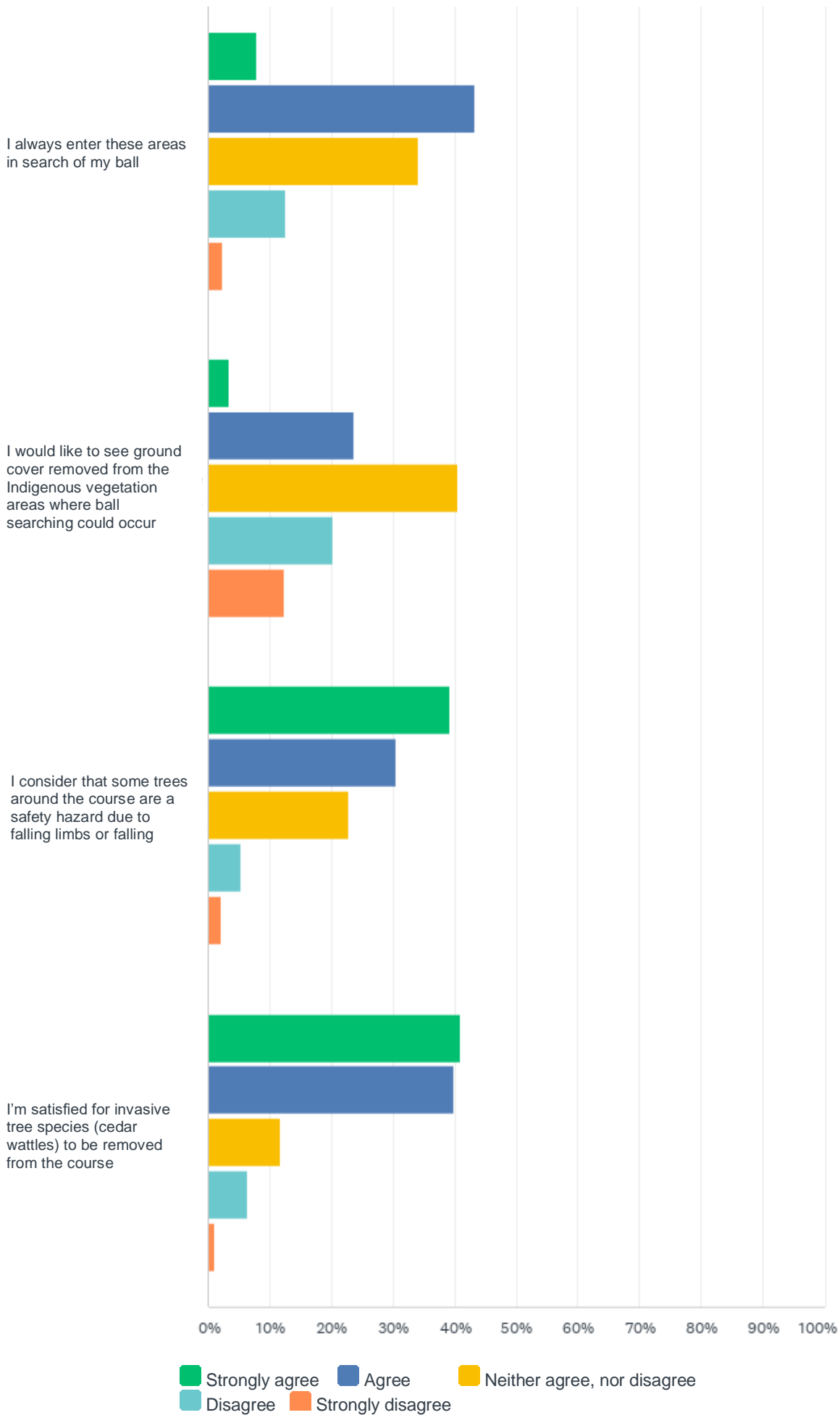
